What does the research say?

Negative Effects:

- **Screen Addiction:** Excessive use of mobile phones, including social media and gaming apps, can lead to screen addiction, which can negatively impact mental health by causing anxiety, depression, and sleep disturbances.
- Cyberbullying: Children and young people can be vulnerable to cyberbullying, which can lead to psychological distress and mental health issues.
- Reduced Physical Activity: Excessive mobile phone use can lead to a sedentary lifestyle, which is associated
 with physical health problems and, indirectly, mental health issues.
- Sleep Disturbances: The use of mobile phones before bedtime can interfere with sleep patterns, which can have a
 detrimental effect on mental health.

What does the research say?

Negative Effects:

- **Fear of Missing Out (FOMO)**: Social media can contribute to the fear of missing out on social events and experiences, leading to feelings of inadequacy and anxiety.
- **Comparison and Self-esteem:** Constant exposure to curated and idealized representations of others' lives on social media can lead to negative self-comparisons and lower self-esteem, particularly among young people.
- Reduced Face-to-Face Interaction: Excessive phone use may lead to reduced face-to-face social interactions,
 which are important for the development of social skills and emotional intelligence.
- Privacy Concerns: The sharing of personal information and the potential for online privacy breaches can lead to stress and anxiety.



What does the research say?

It's important to be self-reflective and be honest about how social media is making you feel. There are many signs that it might be time to take a break from social media.

"These include, finding you often get annoyed or frustrated with people's content, comparing yourself to others to the detriment of your health, reaching for your phone first thing in the morning and last thing at night, scrolling social media when you're with other people, getting into arguments with people online, feeling deflated when you don't receive the engagement you want on a post, and noticing social media is impacting your work,"






DO YOU THINK MOBILE PHONES AFFECT STUDENTS MENTAL HEALTH? 46 responses










ARE MOBILE PHONES A DISTRACTION IN YOUR CLASSES? 401 responses








IN YOUR OPINION, SHOULD WE AS A SCHOOL........ 287 responses













WOULD YOU PREFER IF ACCESS TO THEIR MOBILE PHONE WAS REDUCED DURING THE SCHOOL DAY?

I feel like my phone will be stolen if it is in the box and I feel I'd be bullied about the phone that I own because it's not the best one.

Student Voice

My screen got cracked because I had to put my phone in a box and someone made it crack, so that's why I'm not putting my phone in any boxes anymore.

Phones are a massive problem in the school.

Handing up my phone feels weird and unsecure. Last time I have done that someone took my phone and started taking photos on it I refuse to have to hand up my phone.

Mobile phones should be banned in school, students don't have to communicate with parents while they are in school.

Thank you for trying, a smartphone is not an educational tool, the damage social media can cause through unnecessary dramas and distractions from mild to severe and the impact of this repeated distraction on developing brains and their education, is where educators need to take the lead.

I was shocked by the school allowing the kids to use their phones in class. I had naively assumed they would be locked away. I thought they would only be used in cases of emergency. Not in every free period! I definitely welcome change in this regard.

Mixed feelings when phones used in class for learning - but impossible to control social media use. Impossible task for staff. Respect to the school for all efforts.



I honestly think when students have a phone in their possession all day it's a huge distraction and prevents students from conversing. Students are in a safe environment and a member of staff can call parents if needed.

The impact phones are having on the students ability to socialise and communicate with one another is detrimental. It really acts as an obstacle to building relationships between students and therefore a sense of community overall among the student body.

We need to be guided by International Research which shows that the Educational benefits of phones in school are minimal. Many countries are taking legislative steps to ban the use of Smart Phones in School. We should be doing the same.

HOW IT WORKS

Students bring their Pouch with them to school. Under staff supervision, students turn off their device and put it in their Pouch upon arrival or in the first class.



Students press the green button to secure their Pouch and hold on to it for the day. Students cannot access their phones.



Students tap their Pouch on the Base to open it as they exit. Students take their Pouch home with them.

When you're walking around school you don't see as many people sitting on their own.

Students who relied on their phone were isolated this pushes them to mix.

Has solved a lot of issues.
